How many visually impaired people are there in Brazil?

In Brazil, according to the 2010 Census by the Brazilian Institute of Geography and Statistics (IBGE), there are around 6.5 million visually impaired people. From this total 5.99 million have low vision and other 506 thousand are totally blind. This represents more than 3% of the Brazilian population.

Which were the projects conducted?

DORINATECA: Dorina Nowill Digital Library

We increased the access for visually impaired people to the world of information, culture and education by making available the archive of the Fundação Dorina in the online portal. There are more than 4,428 titles available in Braille, Audio and Digitally Accessible Daisy formats. Directed to the visually impaired people or organizations, such as libraries and schools in the country which work with this kind of audience.

Results: The Dorinateca Service is already available to all the 9 thousand people registed at the Fundação Dorina. There were 1,800 downloads in 4 months that the platform is working.

INCLUSIVE READING NETWORK

Setting up an inclusive national reading network for the accessible material and the inclusion through reading to create effective results. The inclusive Reading Network develops a work of promotion of inclusive reading directed to professionals in all Brazilian regions.

Results: All Brazilian States are part of the Inclusive Reading Network.

27 groups of work are active (24 capital cities + Federal District + 2 municipalities)

AUDIO MAGAZINE

The Fundação Dorina audio magazine aims at spreading information for visually impaired people that look for references to help their development. The project is available in an online platform where the Audio Magazine is inserted and it is available to all stakeholders.

Results:

40 interviews with people who are visually impaired or not. More than 800 readers accessing the content, each week. International access: Argentina, Europe and United States of America.

CLASSICS COLLECTION

The project has helped to ensure that visually impaired children could have access to children's classics in accessible format. Three thousand units were produced from the Classics Collection for schools and public libraries. The collection is made up of 10 titles for children in Braille format, with enlarged font, colorful images and in embossed braille, together with a CD from the audio book enriched with sound effects, aiming at stimulating the different senses of the reader. The books are: Sleeping Beauty, Snow White, Little Red Hiding Hood, Cinderella, Hansel and Gretel, The three little pigs, Peter Pan, Jack and the Beanstalk, Rapunzel and Robin Hood.

Results: Distribution of kits with the 10 titles to 2,900 schools and social organizations all over Brazil. Other 100 units of the collection were used in activities of Fundação Dorina such as services and actions of the Inclusive Reading Network



DORINA NOWILL MEMORY CENTER

The project Learning with the Memory Center aims at offering educational visits from June 2015 to April 2016 to the exhibition "And it all started like this: actions, projects and stories that changed the life of visually impaired people" of the Dorina Nowill Memory Center to around 8,640 children and adolescents from schools and organizations in the city of São Paulo, besides the production and distribution of educational material about the exhibition to visually impaired or not visually impaired children, adolescents and teachers. The material can be in printed, audio, enlarged font and braille version to benefit schools and organizations in the municipality.

Results in 2015: 121 school groups, 3691 visitors, 2 mobile exhibitions in CEU Jardim Paulistano and CEU Campo Limpo, 2 workshops for communities in those same places, 2 trainings for teachers about how to work the subject "diversity" in the classroom.

PROJECT INCLUSIVE LECTURES

We will have conducted from June 2025 to April 2016 awareness, information and guiding activities through educational lectures to 1,500 teachers from 50 schools of the Municipal educational network that work with children from 0 to 17 years of age, therefore helping the inclusion process of visually impaired students. We distributed furthermore 5 thousand kits with supporting material, 100 per school, with content related to educational aspects linked to visually impaired children and adolescents.

Results in 2015: 30 schools received the awareness program. 621 educators of the Municipality of São Paulo took part in the activities.

WITH AN EYE TO THE FUTURE

We train visually impaired youngsters and adults in courses of Braille Revision, Massotherapy, Administrative Routine and Information Technology, stimulating the professional inclusion and the generation of income by those people.

Results: 115 people were qualified for the labor market, 22 were included in the labor market, 8 classes of courses in the areas of Massotherapy, Braille Revision, Administrative Routine and Information Technology.



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
